

Tannistha Samanta is an Assistant Professor in the department of Humanities and Social Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology, Gandhinagar (IITGN). Trained as a social demographer, Samanta locates her research that lies at the interdisciplinary crossroads of sociology and gerontology by blending quantitative and interpretive approaches. She examines gerontological questions relating to intergenerational relationships, health, social capital and the role of culture. She has published in top peer-reviewed journals including *The Journals of Gerontology, Series B: Social Sciences, Aging & Social Policy, Contributions to Indian Sociology* and has recently published an edited volume entitled "*Cross-cultural and Cross-disciplinary Perspectives in Social Gerontology*" (Springer, 2017).
