Message from President

Dear CMC and IMC Members, Greetings!

The fiscal year 2015-16 was full of hopes and new changes in the programme line. The programmes planned for the year were announced by both the Offices in due time-frame. While, the programmes designed for the year 2015-16 remained same on Canadian front, Indian programmes were new in composition and strategy based on our new funding proposal to MHRD.

SICI Programmes for 2015-16

SICI, Canada office announced following programmes: Shastri Research Grant (SRG), Shastri Scholar Travel Subsidy Grant (SSTSG), SICI Student Internship Project in Aid (SSIP in Aid), SICI Partnership Seed Grant in Aid (SSPG in Aid) and Membership Development Fund (MDF). There was enthusiastic response and large number of applications from a majority of members. The bi-national adjudication committees, as always, provided stellar honorary service to SICI by providing independent review of the applications and provided their ranking to the SICI. Based on this review process, the results were announced on 15th December 2015. In summary, Canada office granted 39 awards under different categories as mentioned above in a wide range of disciplines from Electrical Engineering, Chemistry, Food Security, Veterinary Medicine, Mechanical Engineering, Medical Sciences, Literature to Languages, Environmental Science, Social Science and Health Sciences. The grant recipients also came from CMC member Institutions across Canada, such as University of Toronto, University of Alberta, University of British Columbia, Memorial University of Newfoundland, Queens University, Université du Québec à Montréal, York University, University of Saskatchewan, University of Ottawa, McMaster University, University of Lethbridge, Wilfred Laurier University, University of Western Ontario, University of Toronto, University of Alberta, University of Calgary, Ecole de Technologie, University of Manitoba, St. Thomas University, University of Guelph, Concordia University, McGill University, Carleton University and Laval University.

India Office of SICI also announced its programmes in October 2015 with the interim funds released by the MHRD, government of India pending the assessment and approval of new MOU between SICI and MHRD for renewed funding for the next five years. The programs announced were: Shastri Institutional Collaborative Research Grant (SICRG), Shastri Mobility Programme (SMP), and Shastri Research Student Fellowship (SRSF). The applications were received from across the country and the bi-national adjudication committees once again did wonderful service in independent assessment and ranking of all applications. The results are in the process of being announced by the India office. The Institute plans in future to add new subject areas for support in its ambit like Renewable Energy, Agricultural science/ Technology, Environmental Sciences, Teacher education and training,

Health Science Education and Nursing, Marine Sciences and Ocean Studies.

Meetings & Networking

In the month of June 2015, I attended the Quebec Government's official luncheon-meeting to welcome the Consul General of India in Toronto Shri Akhilesh Mishra in Quebec city, which was followed by a private reception for him with Indian community in Quebec City. In November 2015, along with EC member Margaret Walton-Roberts, I met the ASSOCHAM delegation from India in Ottawa and explored the possibility of collaboration with some of its members especially in the areas of Skills development. It was in this visit that both of us were also invited to give presentations: I presented the activities and important role of SICI and Indian Diaspora (of Indian and non-Indian origin) in increasing Canada-India educational collaborations over last half a century at the "Diaspora Symposium" of the 7th Canadian Science Policy Conference in Ottawa. During this meeting, I was also interviewed by the organizers for my views on this subject which can be seen at the SICI website or at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JEiIWFTyG0Q. I was able to utilize this and other opportunities in Ottawa to attend MITACS Award Ceremony and meet numerous other stakeholders to discuss with them about SICI. In addition, I had an invitation to attend a Liberal Party Conference to meet many new Federal Ministers, new members of the parliament and other important players in the new government as a part of our continued efforts to secure funding for SICI Canada operations for the next five years.

I am very pleased to inform you that due to persistent efforts and discussion since February 2015, two of our former member Institutions, namely University of Carleton and University of Ottawa decided to rejoin the SICI family by renewing their membership in appreciation of our longstanding and mutually beneficial relationships with these institutions. We also have welcomed a new member: École de Technologie Supérieure (ETS) of Montreal in the SICI family this year and are at an advanced stage of discussion with two more potential members in the SICI family, namely MacEwan University of Edmonton, Alberta and Royal Roads University of Victoria, British Columbia. In summary our family is growing in size and also in reputation towards a confident march towards our upcoming Golden Jubilee in less than 2 years.

1. Jawaharlal Nehru University

Centre for Canadian, US and Latin American Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University in association with Le Bureau du Québec à Mumbai had a film festival titled 'Shifting Identities and Intercultural Relations in Québec' on Thursday, 29th October, 2015 at 1.30 PM at the School of Arts And Aesthetics Auditorium in Jawaharlal Nehru University.

Three films, 'Black Robe', Mon Oncle Antoine (My Uncle Antoine) and Monsieur Lazhar (Mr. Lazhar) were screened with an introduction given by Professor Marie McAndrew (Visiting Faculty from Faculty of Education, University of Montreal).

2. University of Delhi

Centre for Canadian Studies, DU released a new publication, Gender and Diversity: India, Canada and Beyond, edited by Professor Malashri Lal, Professor Chandra Mohan, Professor Enakshi Sharma, Professor Devika Narula and Professor Amrit Basra, published by Rawat Publications of Jaipur (2015). Professor Dinesh Singh, Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi and H.E. Mr. Nadir Patel, High Commissioner for Canada in India launched the book at a function held at India International Centre on 15th October 2015.

Distinguished litterateur Professor Indra Nath Choudhuri presided over the function. Eminent scholars and Canadianists from Montreal, Toronto, University of Delhi, Jawaharlal Nehru University, Indira Gandhi National Open University and Padam Vibhusan Madam Kapila Vatsayayan, Chair-Asia Project IIC, Air Marshal Naresh Varma, Director-India International Centre, Dr. Prachi Kaul, Acting Director-Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute and a large number of research students and faculty members graced the occasion with their presence.

The book contains twenty scholarly essays reflecting the connections between India, Canada and other countries in a dynamic global study projecting a modern perspective on contemporary challenges of gender, morality, identity formation,



human rights and policy formation, among other prominent conflict areas. The contributors include Professors Sneja Gunew, Jasbir Jain, Malashri Lal, Sushma Yadav, Jameela Begum, Chandra Mohan, Devika Narula and Amrit Basra. The book will prove useful to scholars in Comparative Literature, International Relations, Political Science and Education among other areas.

3. Pondicherry University

Dr. H. Kalpana, Associate Professor, Pondicherry university, presented a paper "An Investigation of African-American Women's writing," in the panel, excavating the Voice: Literature of Nineteenth-Century African-American Women on May 1, 2015 at the 46th annual NEMLA conference in Toronto, Canada and was awarded the post of visiting research fellow at University of Gothenburg, Sweden.



She was Visiting Research fellow for one month at the Dept. of Literature, History of ideas and Religion. University of Gothenburg, Sweden (May 20-June 21, 2015). During her stay Dr. Kalpana presented papers in seminars i.e. "Religio, Literature and Freedom of Speech' with special reference to Perumal Murugan. The paper was reported in Innehåll i Karavan. 4. Queens University, Canada

Professor emeritus Arthur McDonald, Queen's University, is the co-winner of Nobel Prize in physics 2015.Dr. McDonald won the award, along with Takaaki Kajita of the University of Tokyo, "for their key contributions to the experiments which demonstrated that neutrinos

change identities." Dr. McDonald received the call from the Nobel committee at 5 am adding that he immediately had a feeling of "tremendous accomplishment by our team."

"I am truly honoured to receive the Nobel Prize in physics," Dr. McDonald says. It was a momentous day not only for Dr. McDonald but for Queen's as well. Dr. McDonald arrived at Queen's in 1989, was the inaugural Gordon and Patricia Gray Chair in Particle Astrophysics and served as the director of SNO, now known as SNOLAB. Dr. McDonald has been a professor emeritus since 2013. He earned his PhD in 1969 from the California Institute of Technology.
