Message from President

Dear CMC and IMC Members,
Greetings!

We start with excellent news that the Ministry of Human Resource & Development (MHRD), Government of India has released the first installment of operational funds for SICI for the year 2015-16. Therefore, SICI India office could use the programme-related part of this funding envelope to announce the results of the grant competition which was announced in October 2015. The following categories of programmes were funded in this competition viz Shastri Institutional Collaborative Research Grant (SICRG), Shastri Mobility Programme (SMP), and Shastri Research Student Fellowship (SRSF). In summary, India office awarded 12 grants in different categories to institutions across India and Canada, such as Indian Institute of Technology-Kharagpur, Indian Institute of Technology -Bombay, Institute of Technology- Kanpur, Institute of Technology- Roorkee, SNDT Women's University, Mumbai, National Law School of India, University-Nagarabhavi, University of Agricultural Sciences- Dharwad, Jamia Milia Islamia Univeristy-Delhi, University of Delhi, Pondicherry Central University, and Jadavpur University, as well as University of Ottawa, University of British Columbia, University of Manitoba and McGill University. The domain of studies covered under this grant also reflected the growing trend of all-round support that SICI provides to different disciplines in our member institutions, such Biotechnology, Law, Bio-resource Engineering, Psychology, Management, Child Education, English Literature, Mass Communication, Agricultural Engineering, Biological Sciences, Pharmaceutical Sciences and Medical Science & Technology. Four bi-national adjudication committees composed of experts in different disciplines did excellent work in impartial assessment of all applications to recommend the merit list of all applications, which formed the basis of the grants declared by India office. There have been comments from some of our members that in future, SICI programs need to take into account the differences in the presentation and evaluation criteria in different disciplines and hence a care must be taken to equitable and merit-based awarding of grants in all disciplines

from social sciences to STEM subjects. These suggestions are under active consideration by the current EC would be subject of discussion at both the CMC meeting in Ottawa and IMC/AGM meetings in Delhi in the month of May 2016.

Meetings & Networking

I, along with Dr. Margaret Walton-Roberts had a teleconference with the Governor General of Canada, His Excellency, David Johnston on January 14, 2016. The topics of discussion ranged from the role of Shastri in Canada-India Higher Education Corridor – past, present and future, SICI's golden jubilee year in 2017-18 and SICI's plans to announce a special student scholarship award program (suggested name: Shastri-Laurier Golden Jubilee award") to commemorate the occasion, role played by Shastri Institute in the implementation of GIAN program of MHRD, funding challenges from the Canadian side and the new MOU to be signed by both the governments. I am pleased to inform you that the discussion with the GG was on a very positive note and GG appreciated the role played by Shastri Institute and extended his moral support on the funding initiatives with the Government of Canada.

I am also happy to report that on 4th February 2016, an event held at the Carleton University-Ottawa to celebrate the release of the 2016 edition of "A-list of Indo-Canadians and Friends of India" published by the India Diaspora editor Mr. Ajit Jain, SICI was recognized and honoured in the list and in person as an organization that has played a major role in the development of Educational Collaboration between Canada and India for last half a century. It was a well-attended event and SICI's Secretary/Treasurer Professor Mathieu Boisvert was also named in this list for his contribution to the bilateral educational causes. SICI was a co-sponsor of this event along with Carleton University.

I along with Prof. Mathieu Boisvert and Ms. Mahmuda Aldeen also used this opportunity to meet with Andreas R. Weichert, Julia Drew Watt, Aline Brault, and Ivy Learner-Frank from Global Affairs Canada (GAC),

formerly known as DFATD to discuss about SICI and its ongoing work as well as the upcoming funding application of SICI-Canada to Government of Canada for the next five years. We invited the GAC team to attend the upcoming CMC meetings and conferences in May in Ottawa and updated them on the support extended by Government of India to SICI, as well as the renewal of the existing MOU on educational collaboration that was recently approved by both Governments of Canada and India. We discussed and presented a draft of SICI Canada's Five Year Funding Proposal to GAC team for their input. In general, I perceived a sense of change in policies of the new Canadian Government that could be more open and strongly supportive of the type of activities that SICI has been fostering since last five years in a very nimble, flexible and cost-efficient manner over last nearly five decades. The GAC team reflected that SICI is going in the right direction in terms of bringing more awareness about its activities to the stakeholders. On the same note, they recommended to liaise closely with the Canadian High Commissioner in India along with three ministers of Government of Canada who run different parts of Global Affairs Canada, namely Honorable ministers Stéphane Dion (Quebec) - Foreign Affairs; Chrystia Freeland (Ontario) - International Trade; and Marie-Claude Bibeau (Quebec) - International Development and La francophonie.

Strategic endeavor

As a part of our strategy of engagement, I met the Indian High Commissioner and updated him on the current activities of SICI and sought his guidance and advise to move forward to secure funding for SICI from the Government of Canada. A copy of five year draft Funding Proposal (2016-2021) was shared with His

Excellency during our meeting on February 04, 2016 along with a copy of the chapter entitled "Scripting a New Future in Education" that highlights role of SICI in fostering educational collaboration between Canada and India written by three members of the current EC (Shah, Chattopadhyay and Boisvert) in the book "Modi and the World: The Ring View Inside Out" edited by Yamini Chowdhury and Ansuya Diya Chowdhury published by Bloomsbury India and released on 26th February 2016.

As is our normal practice, education-related conferences will take place along with the CMC/IMC meetings in Canada and India, and we strongly urge all CMC and IMC members as well as other representatives from their institutions to participate in these conferences.

2) Call for articles – Canada and the great war

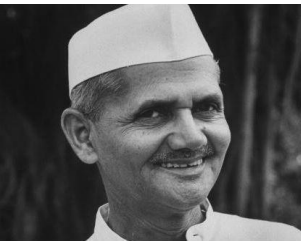

50th death anniversary of Late Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri



Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute paid homage to Late Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri, the second Prime Minister of India, who succeeded Jawaharlal Nehru in June 1964, died in Tashkent soon after signing an agreement with President Ayub Khan of Pakistan, with Soviet Prime Minister Alexei Kosygin playing a mediatory role.

January 11, 2016 marks the 50th death anniversary of Lal Bahadur Shastri, whose demise still remains shrouded in mystery. Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute commemorated the day by notifying the 50th death anniversary on its website. During the 1965 war, Late Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri gave the slogan of 'Jai Jawan Jai Kisan' (Hail the soldier Hail the farmer). He was an outstanding leader who was born in the year 1904 in Varansi to Smt. Ramdulari Devi and Sharada Prasad Shrivastava. Late Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri was the first Indian to receive Bharat Ratna Award posthumously in 1966, which is the highest civilian award.
