### **Executive Council Meeting — Report**

Shastri's Executive Council meeting took place in India December 11-12. The meetings were an excellent opportunity for the senior team to take stock, review the year, and further the implementation of Shastri's Strategic Action Plan.

With an eye towards the action plan, EC has set forth a number of initiatives to be carried out by Shastri's Canadian and Indian offices in the New Year. More information will be available in the next Shastri e-Newsletter.

### **Shastri Regional Symposia — Update**

Engaging India has already established itself as a fantastic opportunity for local CMC/IMC member institutions to talk up their research and collaborations. The schedule for workshops including BC has yet to be ratified, but here are tentative plans thus far:

Late-March 2011 – Atlantic Canada June 2011 – Ontario, in conjunction with CMC annual meeting  
October 2011 – Quebec February 2012 – Alberta

Each regional symposium will have themes that reflect the work of member institutions and their involvement in and with India. All symposia will embrace some aspect of international development. Look for more details on specific dates, locations, and how you can get involved.

### **Youth Internship at Shastri — Potential Renewed Program for 2011**

On the heels of the Executive Council meeting in Lucknow, India, Shastri staff took time out to strengthen ties with two agencies — the National Council of Rural Institutes (NCRI), and Centre for Research in Rural and Industrial Development (CRRID). The focus of the meetings was to determine partnerships and the feasibility of re-establishing a youth internship program for Shastri.

As discussions continue, Shastri hopes to initiate the program early in 2011.

### **NAFSA 2011 — Shastri to Present India to the World**

Shastri has been asked to present India in all its diversity, culture, and heritage to the 2011 North American International Educator's Association (NAFSA) Annual conference; which will take place in Vancouver next June. This is an event that will have over 10,000 delegates from all over the world and as the host city and country a large number of international educators from Canada. Shastri President Sunaina Singh will lead a group in a dynamic session that will better illustrate the beauty of India for those not familiar with the nation. Topics will have a decidedly non-academic focus: India's regions and what makes them distinct from each other in terms of geography, customs, culture and development. The session is meant to serve as an introduction to India for those who have not travelled extensively to its regions.

Sheila Embleton, a well known canadianist, has recently been elected Fellow to the Royal Society of Canada. This is the highest honour a scholar can achieve in the Arts, Humanities and Sciences. Sheila Embleton is the leading expert in mathematical methods in historical linguistics and dialectology. Her 1986 book on family tree reconstruction still anchors the field. Her revolutionary digital methods led to major advances in Finnish and Romanian dialectology. Archeologists and geneticists cite her innovative interdisciplinary research, a true marriage of mathematics and humanities. She also solved the elusive origins of Suomi and Bermuda.
